

CHECKPOINT CHARLIE

The Cold War, the Berlin Wall and the Most Dangerous Place on Earth

Constable - 24th October 2019 - Hardback £20.00

A powerful, fascinating, and ground-breaking history of Checkpoint Charlie, the famous military gate on the border of East and West Berlin.

Published to coincide with the thirtieth anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall, *Checkpoint Charlie* is a vivid and poignant exploration of the history through the lens of interwoven first-person experiences.

East Germany committed a billion dollars to the creation of the Berlin Wall in the early 1960s, an eleven-foot-high barrier consisting of seventy-nine miles of fencing, 300 watchtowers, 250 guard dog runs, twenty bunkers, operated around the clock by guards who shot to kill. Over the next twenty-eight years, at least five thousand people attempted to smash through it, swim across it, tunnel under it, or fly over it.

In November 1989, the East German leadership buckled in the face of a civil revolt that culminated in half a million East Berliners demanding an end to the ban on free movement. The world's media flocked to capture the moment which, perhaps more than any other, signalled the end of the Cold War. Checkpoint Charlie had been the epicentre of global conflict for nearly three decades.

Checkpoint Charlie includes never-before-heard interviews with the men who built and dismantled the Wall; children who crossed it; relatives and friends who lost loved ones trying to escape over it; military policemen and soldiers who guarded the checkpoints; CIA, MI6, and Stasi operatives who oversaw operations at and across its borders; politicians whose ambitions shaped it; journalists who recorded its story; and many more whose living memories contributed to the full story.

74th ROYAL MILITARY POLICE ASSOCIATION ANNUAL REUNION WEEKEND 15th - 17th MAY 2020, IN THE CITY OF PORTSMOUTH, HAMPSHIRE

GENERAL

- 1. The 74th Annual Reunion Weekend will be held over the period of 15th 17th May 2020 in the City of Portsmouth at the Best Western Royal Beach Hotel, St Helens Parade, Portsmouth, Hampshire PO4 0RN
- 2. The weekend will be hosted and funded by the Royal Military Police Association, Depot Branch, led by the Chairman Mr Jack Duncan and the members of his Reunion Committee.

OUTLINE OF EVENTS

- 3. The outline of events covering the whole weekend are:
 - a. Friday 15th May 2020

<u>Arrival in Portsmouth</u>. Members of the hosting Branch and the National Chair will be present in the Reception of the hotel to welcome and assist guests as required. Dinner will be held in the Ark Royal restaurant from 1900 hrs - 2100 hrs and will take the form of a buffet/carvery.

- b. Saturday 16th May 2020
 - (i) Trustees' Meeting. The Trustees' meeting will be held in the Intrepid Room commencing at 1030 hrs.
 - (ii) Annual General Meeting (AGM). The AGM will take place in the Intrepid Room commencing at 1430 hrs. If you are a member of the Association you are encouraged to attend.
 - (iii) <u>Annual Reunion Dinner</u>. The Reunion Dinner will be held in the Invincible Room commencing at 1930 hrs. You are requested to be seated no later than 1925 hrs. Dress is civilian clothes (dark suit or blazers for gentlemen, ladies as appropriate).
- c. Sunday 13th May 2020
 - (i) Church Service. A short non-denominational service is to be held within the hotel.
 - (ii) <u>Parade of Standards/March Past</u>. We have been given permission to parade on the promenade opposite the hotel, between the South Parade Pier and the D-Day Museum.

ACCOMMODATION PACKAGES

- 4. The hotel's entire accommodation has been booked solely for the RMPA weekend. The number of rooms is limited.
 - a. Package From Friday 15th May

£112.50p per person. This includes dinner on the Friday evening, bed and breakfast for Friday and Saturday. i.e. For two people sharing a room the cost will be £225 for the two night package. The cost is based on a double or twin room including dinner on the Friday evening.

- b. <u>Saturday Night</u> 16th May **only** including breakfast. £87.50p per double or twin room. £62.50 p per single room.
- c. <u>Extra Nights B&B</u> £87.50p per double or twin room. £62.50p per single room.
- d. <u>Sea View Supplement</u> £15 per room.

Please use the Booking Form at Annex A. **PLEASE NOTE**: Rooms can only be booked by using the said form, **DO NOT** phone the hotel or attempt to book on line, it will not work.

It is emphasised that the booking of accommodation is totally the responsibility of individual members.

DINNER/REUNION BAR

- 6. Dinner, which costs £35 per head including port, will be held in the Invincible Room at 1930 hrs and you are asked to be seated by 1925 hrs. A maximum of 250 persons may be seated.
- 7. The main bar of the hotel will be open at all times and on the night of the dinner an additional bar will be opened adjacent to the dining area. During the weekend there will be a discount on drinks and you will be given a Discount Card by the hotel on booking in.
- 8. Dinner will be of three courses consisting of Carrot and Coriander Soup served with croutons, Chicken wrapped in Parma ham with Madeira Sauce, Mixed Forest Fruit Panna Cotta plus tea/coffee and be inclusive of a glass of port for toasts. There is an alternative vegetarian option for the main course and that is Mushroom, Brie and Cranberry Wellington. Please ensure you advise the hotel of any special dietary requirements. Meals can be adapted for Gluten free.
- 9. Ticket applications, using the form at Annex B, should be sent to Mr Campbell-Smith. (Address shown on the Form). Cheques should be made payable to "RMPA Depot Branch". Closing date for applications will be <u>21 APRIL</u> <u>2020</u> following which no further applications will be accepted and no refunds given in the event of cancellation or subsequent non-attendance.

TRAVEL

- 10. Travel to Portsmouth is outlined below:
 - a. <u>By air</u>. Portsmouth is served by Southampton Airport and is approximately 45 minutes from the hotel.
 - b. <u>By road</u>. Head to Portsmouth and enter either on the M275 (Western approach) or on the A2030 (Eastern approach). Follow the signs for the Seafront. You will know if you have gone too far as you will have a sinking feeling! Satnavs tend to direct you on to the M275.
 - c. <u>By rail</u>. By train to either *Portsmouth and Southsea* or *Portsmouth Harbour* stations. Both stations are a short taxi ride from the hotel.
 - d. <u>Car Parking</u>. The hotel does have limited parking. There is a NCP park to the east of the hotel but there is on road parking on the roads around the hotel. If you do use the hotel's car park be sure to book your vehicle in at Reception.

SUMMARY

11. The hotel is ideally located on sea front with many attractions in walking distance or a short bus ride away. The South Parade Pier which is opposite the hotel has been restored with bars and restaurants and there is a local convenience shop beneath the new block of apartments to the west of the hotel.
