National Police Memorial Day.

Today, 29 Sep 24, National Police Memorial Day, tribute was paid to the police officers who made the ultimate sacrifice protecting and serving their communities at one of the memorials and spaces at the Arboretum dedicated to remembering the service of the Police.

The UK Police Memorial is a 12-metre-tall structure that honours the courage and sacrifice of members of the UK Police Service.

A brass screen with leaf-shaped apertures forms a doorway, providing a symbolic threshold to the dangerous places where Police are required to serve. It is a permanent memorial to commemorate police officers and staff from across the UK who have died while protecting the public.

The Beat (Police Memorial Avenue) is planted with a tree for every police service in the UK and various police representative associations.

Due to a death in one of our branches a chap contacted me and asked how he may be afforded an email with the domain name @rmpa.org.uk, that started a very interesting conversation, for me one that I have had several times with various people over the last 8 years, but it's never ever resulted in someone saying "I will sort that" - until now that is.

The domain name @rmpa.org.uk is currently registered to an individual Association member who kindly set it up and registered it for me, that person is now regrettably unwell. The domain is up for renewal in October.

My clear aim has always been to get all branch officers on to an @rmpa.org.uk email so for example the secretary at a given branch would be contactable by email as follows <u>secretary.timbuktu@rmpa.org.uk</u>, similarly the Chair at that branch would be <u>chair.timbuktu@rmpa.org.uk</u> (please do not try and contact them they are out of office!!!!) whilst Association officers would be as per mine so Bob P would be <u>chair@rmpa.org.uk</u> Taff would be <u>Treasurer@rmpa.org.uk</u>

I'm sure you get the picture the idea being then that those emails would be managed by the individual but owned by the Association who would be able to simply amend the managed name at any point and assign it to a new person.

Trustees would I suggest being <u>TrusteeNI@rmpa.org.uk</u> Trustee Scotland etc Trustee Wales etc with some tweaking needed if our geographical spread alters. Serving officers would simply be <u>TrusteeSeniorServing@rmpa.org.uk</u> <u>ProSM@rmpa.org.uk</u> <u>President@rmpa.org.uk</u>

So, there is the back ground to one thought process. We have discussed many times in the past other linked issues - sharing of information, sharing of newsletters, central document storage etc.

I have asked John Tasker of Manchester Branch to explore Google Workspace with a view to us all being able to have the above emails plus a central storage facility - both "public" (open to those who are invited - in essence any member seeking to gain access) and "Secure" (open only to certain profiles users - Trustees for the Trustee file, Branch Officers and members for the Timbuktu Branch File or Vanuatu Branch - you get the picture.

Google Workspace have confirmed that we may be entitled to a huge free package affording such things as 20tb of secure storage, 2 thousand free email accounts, free access to the Google Office package - Docs and sheets etc.

John has started the ball rolling - he was former Corps Officer (1990 - 1999), is good member of Manchester Branch, runs his own companies, is very tech savvy and most importantly WILLING AND ABLE to assist and guide.

Nothing has been set up, yet we will have to start once Google confirm our acceptance as charitable organisation. I have asked the current owner of the domain to release it or sell it to us, which we need to do any way.
