Thanks to Peter for passing on the following information. On Sunday 7 September 25 at around 3pm, mobile phones on 4G and 5G networks across the country will vibrate and emit a loud siren-like sound for up to ten seconds. A test message will appear on screens, making it clear the alert is a drill.

Code of Conduct.

As you are all aware there has previously been a number of discussions regarding Rule 13, which related primarily to forfeiture of membership of the Association. It was felt that the Rule was outdated and the Association needed to consider either updating or replacing it with a Code of Conduct.

At the recent AGM one of the actions for the Trustees was to compile a Code of Conduct, which we have now completed.

A briefing document outlining the Code of Conduct, has been incorporated into the Association Rules and is available on the website: https://rmpa.org.uk/rmpa-rules/

The Code of Conduct includes a section for all members and a separate section for Association appointees.

Individuals can report potential breaches of the Code online: https://rmpa.org.uk/policies/report-of-code-of-conduct-breach/ or internally within a Branch.

Depending on the nature of the breach this will either be investigated and dealt with within a Branch or at National Level, with independent Branch members or Trustees appointed by the Chair to investigate / review the complaint.

The potential sanctions are outlined in the Code and individuals can appeal the decision, which will be heard by three Trustees appointed by the Chair that have not been involved with the process.

Trustees are able to remove an individual's membership of the Association and the decision to do so can be taken at any point in time, and this decision no longer requires a vote being taken at the AGM.

If after reviewing the documents you have any questions, please let me or Peter know. If needed, we can host an online meeting to discuss / clarify any concerns.

I wish to make it clear that I would welcome such notices and would include them in the Journal - but I don't receive any. I know that there is a misconception that Obituaries are only for Officers, but I would like it known that this is not the case for the RMP Journal. If you take the time to write it, I will print it.

If you're planning a visit to the Arboretum this summer, don't forget that you can get here on the sevenday regular shuttle bus service from Tamworth Rail Station.

You'll find the timetable on our website, along with the timetable for connecting services from Alrewas Village to Lichfield and Burton.

Each journey costs £3 per passenger and trips are free for National Concessionary Bus Pass holders. This bus service is funded by Staffordshire County Council and operated by Diamond Bus East Midlands to make it easier for people to visit who either don't own a vehicle or prefer more sustainable transport options.

VJ Day 80 — Eighty Years Since the Guns Fell Silent in the Pacific

Sean Taylor our Association Vice Chair penned the following.

I thought appropriate to pen some words on seeing Owen at the NMA proudly representing his generation and showing that remembrance has a future as well as a past ... simply amazing.

Today, 15 August 2025, as we are all aware, marks 80 years since Victory over Japan Day—when Imperial Japan's surrender brought the Second World War to its final close.

This anniversary is more than a date in history; it's a moment to remember the courage, sacrifice, and resilience of those who served in the Far East and the Pacific. From the *Forgotten Army* who fought through Burma's jungles, to the prisoners of war who endured unimaginable suffering, their stories remain as vital now as in 1945.

VJ Day also reminds us that peace did not come neatly. In the months and years after, nations and families worked to heal, rebuild, and reconcile. The legacy of that time is not just in memorials or history books—it's in the freedoms, opportunities, and stability we often take for granted today.

For many families, including my own, VJ Day lives on in stories, photos, and the duty to keep the peace.

It shows us that peace isn't history - it's a choice our generation must make, every day. Let's see what happens in Alaska tonight...

Hot on the heels of our recent VJ Day posts, today we bring you one of the rarest artefacts in the Museum collection; The "slouch hat" worn by No 7945161 Sergeant Percy Smith of the Corps of Military Police (India), CMP (I).

This very hat was worn in Burma during 1944/45 when Percy was attached to the 5th (Indian) Infantry Division Provost Company. Note the scarlet band in the "pugri" and the red on blue MP "flash" on the upturned brim.

The Museum has on display a large variety of rare headgear that was totally unique to the Military Police. Some of them, like this very hat, are some of the only known remaining examples. Why not pay us a visit and see some fine examples of the "Redcap".

It was a splendid affair featuring local entertainment, food and drink of the highest quality. The committee are to be congratulated on organising and producing a weekend that was second to none. The bar for future dinners has certainly been raised. This was my first time visiting Belfast since the late 70s, I was surprised and delighted in the changes that have taken place. It is certainly a lively, friendly and vibrant City that could not be more different from the one that most of us knew. I agree totally with Graham Woodcock who during dinner said, "It is obvious that the younger generation have never lived under the threat of the troubles, and it shows". Hopefully long may it continue, and they will never return to the old ways.

History of N I Branch. Tanky Walker.

Northern Ireland, during the late seventies and early eighties, was still in turmoil with many gun and bomb attacks being carried out by the IRA as well as Protestant Paramilitaries adding their own agenda. Security was extremely tight in all areas, many people did not venture out at night, so where do you begin to try and start to form an RMPA Branch in the Province.

There had been an Association in earlier years which had met at Victoria Barracks, Belfast, but once the "Troubles" started to escalate it was no longer feasible to have meetings or run the Branch, so it folded. Depot had very few records and only a few names of former members – most of these had moved and were not traceable.

In 1981 Tanky Walker decided to set about re-forming the NI Branch and with the help of John McNeil, they started out on a task that would take them nearly 4 years to accomplish.

Because it was a Military Association everything had to be kept a close secret, there was no possibility of advertising in local newspapers etc, everything had to be done by word of mouth.

The first area of concern was where we would hold meetings. It would be impossible to have them in the local bars or clubs; luckily the resident Provost Company in Thiepval Barracks in Lisburn came to our aid and offered us the use of the RMP Cpl's Mess.

This venue was ideal but still involved massive security to get into the barracks. In the early days members would be held at the guardroom, sometimes for up to 45 minutes before we would be allowed to enter. Many new members found this too tiresome and did not bother either attending or remaining as a member. The dedicated ones held firm and stayed the course.

At last, in 1985 the Branch was ready for opening, representatives from the Depot attended the inaugural meeting in Sandhurst Block. A Committee was elected, and the Branch was up and running. Within the year we had our Branch Standard, but it was going to be many years before we were able to parade it openly in NI.

During the early years the majority of the membership were serving or retired members of the Police or Prison Service with some who were RMP TA and Government workers. All were targets in the eyes of the IRA, so security was the first concern.

Branch members would attend various events on the Mainland where we could parade our Standard with pride, we longed to be able to do it at home, but security deemed it otherwise.

Our biggest problem was trying to arrange functions. We had to find a reasonably secure location - this involved the Branch using Prison and Police Service Clubs as well as, on occasion, Military Messes. It was also customary to arrange to have a police and military presence in the area for our protection.

Another problem with any function was you had no idea how many would turn up, you booked the venue, paid for a group to play ordered the meal and then there could be a big security alert which would render more than half of the membership unavailable, it was fingers crossed that it would be "alright on the night"

Whereas other Branches could freely go about their business, we were severely restricted in what we could do. This Branch has endured many hardships over the last 40 years; it is with great credit to the members that they have remained loyal to the Branch throughout.

Over the years we have used many different venues within Thiepval Barracks for our meetings. As RMP involvement in the Province declined, so the available facilities became less and less. Eventually we moved out of the Barracks to our new home at the Lisburn Masonic Hall.

This year we celebrate our 40th Anniversary. Those returning to enjoy our celebratory dinner will certainly see a huge difference from when they served here. Nowadays we quite openly parade in full regalia, berets, medals and with our Standard at many events throughout the Province and even in Southern Ireland, which would have been unthinkable many years ago. The Branch have also forged great links with the Military Police Association Ireland.

Over the years we have been invited to the home of the Irish President, Michael D Higgins in Phoenix Park Dublin and for the last 4 years have been invited, along with members of the RMPA Rol Branch, to provide Wreath Escorts to the President of Ireland and to the President of the Irish RBL at their Remembrance Service in St Patricks Cathedral, Dublin.


